Warm Springs Preserve offers a unique opportunity for large-scale, community-supported restoration of natural spaces.

The final Master Plan was approved in April 2023 after an 11-month process during which the community and key stakeholders considered several visions for the property. Designed for success over time, the plan seeks to preserve a natural space with a restored creek and floodplain that support year-round recreational activities.
