

Q1 How would you rate the current availability of seating on Main Street for resting, enjoying your lunch or waiting for the bus?





Q2 The city's current standard for trash can placement is two at each intersection on opposing diagonal corners. Do you agree with this trash can standard on Main Street?









Q14 Do you agree with the goals of the draft Art & History Plan? If not, please tell us why.









Q17 In the vein of arts and history, how do you feel about treating the entrances to town?








Q20 What value do you see in the addition of historical and wayfinding directional signage?
